**Featured Website: Pinterest**

Need some inspiration? [Pinterest](http://Pinterest) is a virtual bulletin board website, where you can "pin" your favorite ideas to bulletin boards and browse boards created by other people who share your interests. Type a topic in the search bar ("Thanksgiving craft" or "phonics") and numerous inch-square pictures will pop up. Hit a square and you are directed to the original website with the description or directions, or you can simply "repin" the idea to your own board for future reference.

If you notice someone whose ideas tickle your fancy (we happen to like Fran Richardson) you can "follow" them and their new pins will pop up when you log in. Sample idea for use: Use your board with a variety of students for articulation; compare/contrast; descriptive language; expressing opinions; even social thinking. Boards are unlimited and most people have 6 - 12 different clipboards on a variety of topics such as "Things that Make Me Laugh" or "Holiday Crafts." One caveat is that Pinterest is very popular, and you must be "invited" to join and create boards. I simply put a note on my Facebook account, and had an "invitation" in 5 minutes. It's really fun to see who you know with boards, and follow them - maybe you will start a trend at your school!
