

## SUMMARY OF CERTIFICATION/LICENSE REQUIREMENTS IN CALIFORNIA JOB SETTINGS FOR PROSPECTIVE GRADUATES TRAINED OUT OF STATE

## It is strongly recommended that clinicians new to the field obtain and maintain all three to maximize future employment options. Regulations and supervision are similar, however, refer to each governing body and the <u>PCSS CF/RPE Flow Chart</u> for further information.

| ENTRY LEVEL<br>CERTIFICATION             | Begin with Preliminary Speech-Language<br>Pathology Services Credential. Requires 36 weeks of<br>supervision after an accredited graduate program.<br>After clinical fellowship completed, applicants can<br>apply for a Certificate of Clinical Competence. | Begin with RPE Temporary License. | APPLICATION<br>Links and<br>Instructions | Credential Application Packet<br>Check the last page of this application link to see<br>whether your state's training is equivalent to CA.<br>If your state is "non-equivalent", collect the<br>required statement from your Department Chair<br>before you leave the program, if you might move<br>to California. Submit this statement with your<br>application after your degree is conferred.** | ASHA Guide to Clinical Fellowship Experience<br>There is no formal application, but follow the<br>ASHA guidelines carefully to ensure your<br>supervision meets ASHA requirements.                              | Application Package for RPE Temporary License<br>You may apply for a temporary license up to 75<br>days before you graduate, but you must have an<br>assigned employment site and signed supervisor<br>statement. You cannot work as a speech<br>pathologist without an approved temporary<br>license (or preliminary credential if your<br>practice type allows this). |
| APPROVAL PROCESS                         | You do not have to have a job to apply, but your<br>degree must be conferred. Processing is 8–12<br>weeks after all materials are submitted and<br>Master's Program is complete. In some cases, the<br>County Department of Education can expedite<br>this process after you have been hired.   | Supervision begins when you begin working.<br>Requires either a preliminary credential (if you are<br>in the schools) or a temporary license<br>(generally any setting).  | Submit materials as soon as they are available.<br>Processing is 8–12 weeks after submission<br>of the application.   |
| WHEN CAN I<br>Begin Working              | Upon approval of a preliminary credential or<br>temporary license, you may work in<br>a school setting.   | Dependent on your temporary license and preliminary credential approval.  | Private practice, hospital, and rehab settings<br>require temporary license approval. Schools<br>generally require license or credential approval.  |

\*\*Credential Statement Sample wording: "This letter verifies that Marissa Rivera completed a practicum with school-aged children with a grade of 'C' or better as indicated by the transcript grade for Course # XXX. Upon completion of her Master's Degree (date), she will be eligible to provide service in the K-12 public schools in our state as a speech language pathologist."

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
